## Town Council Meeting

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### Meeting Minutes

JANUARY 19, 2022

#### I. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. and was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### II. ROLL CALL

Present at the meeting were Mayor Paul, Vice Mayor Whitman, and Councilmembers Hattan, Starkey and Luis. Also present were Town Administrator Lemack, Deputy Town Administrator Lewis, Assistant Town Administrator Holste, Town Attorney Weinthal, and Town Clerk Roig.

#### III. PRESENTATIONS

- Lorenzo Medina USA Boxing National Heavy Weight Champion**  
Tim Albury stated that the Davie PAL had a rich history in boxing with over 11 years as part of the boxing program with many children becoming champions. Mr. Medina along with three other Davie PAL boxers attended the USA National Championships in Shreveport, Louisiana in December of 2021. Two boxers from the Davie PAL went on to the quarterfinals, one to the semi-finals, and Mr. Medina, the heavyweight, won the National Championship under USA Boxing. Mr. Albury advised that at this time, Mr. Medina was the number one heavyweight in the United States.  
Mayor Paul and the Town Council presented Mr. Medina with a certificate of recognition for his commitment and dedication to the sport and congratulated him.

Shwanda Barnette and I'm your ambassador from the Florida League of Cities honored to Councilwoman Susan Starkey with the Mayor John Land Years of Service Award in honor of 20 years of service to the Town of Davie.
- Shop with a Cop, Stephen Kinsey, Police Chief**  
Angela Madias recognized the departments/divisions who assists with the toy drive and two gift-giving events which benefited the children of Davie. Toys were provided to toys to the Boys and Girls Club, Sheridan House Ministries, Davie Police Athletic League, and Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital.  
The Davie Police Athletic League hosted a Shop with a Cop event at the Davie Walmart Supercenter on December 18<sup>th</sup> where 154 children participated.
- New Town Hall Update, Richard J. Lemack, Town Administrator and Teen Woon, Cartaya and Associates Architects P.A.**  
Richard J. Lemack, Town Administrator, introduced Teen Woon from Cartaya and Associates. Mr. Lemack advised that he was reviewing Town Hall Campus site plan as well as the new Town Hall exterior appearance. Mr. Lemack stated that the plan was to close 65th Way between Southwest 42nd Street and Southwest 43rd Street, while completing the previously approved roadway on the east side

of Huck Liles. A roundabout was added at the Southwest 65th Way and Southwest 43rd Street intersection. In front of the Rodeo Arena the green space was expanded the green space and we have added a drop-off and a pickup area. The parking lot accommodated eight American Disabilities Act spaces four in the employee parking area and four in the visitor's parking area with a redesigned Veteran's parking.

Town Council parking, as it is today on the west side of the building remains. The new town hall has a designated drop-off and pickup area in the front of the building similar to the Rodeo Arena.

Mr. Lemack stated that at the town hall area itself, a new town hall would be constructed without impacting any of the native vegetation, for which an inventory had been conducted. Additionally, the vegetation would be protected throughout construction which also included the coontie species.

Mr. Lemack advised that all items were cataloged including all the historical items located at the town hall campus and a secondary inventory would be completed. Items inventoried included the time capsule, all memorial items including trees, benches, Town Council Chamber, and chamber's chairs. The new town hall was currently planned at four stories. The building captured the elements of the western design manual with maintenance-friendly faux wood and stacked stone. The town hall incorporated other major western characteristics including large roof overhangs, covered porches, metal roofing, a clock, and a wind vane.

In addition to the architectural linkage to the past, the building will highlight the Town's history through the replication of the town hall entrance. The site plan maintained the open space that existed on Orange Drive as the building was set back 80 feet. The town hall exterior appearance included textured stucco in various areas, stacked stone, and the metal roofing.

### IX. OLD BUSINESS

#### 27. Southwest 148th Avenue and Sheridan Street Intersection Improvements Update, Richard J. Lemack, Town Administrator and Jonathan Vogt, Town Engineer

Town Engineer, Jonathan Vogt, provided an update on the proposed Sheridan Street and Southwest 148th Avenue intersection improvements. These improvements were proposed as part of the Broward County Surtax project to widen Sheridan Street from Flamingo Road to Southwest 148th Avenue from four to six lanes and was currently in the planning and design phases. Town Council previously passed resolution R 2021-128 to support a left-turn lane, providing for the opportunity to receive input from the seven Ivanhoe communities immediately adjacent to Southwest 148th Avenue between Sheridan Street and Griffin Road. Mr. Vogt provided an aerial map of the existing signalized intersection conditions at Sheridan Street and Southwest 148th Avenue. Mr. Vogt noted that the Holman Automotive Group had ingress on the south side of the intersection and requested a left and a right-turn from their property to travel either east or westbound on Sheridan Street. Staff reached out to the presidents of Sheridan Glen, Crossbow, Falcon's Lea Patio Homes, Waterford Patio Homes, Ivan Waterford, and Chelsea at Ivanhoe for initial discussion on the intersection improvements. The Town held two public community meetings with the Association representatives on July 14, 2021 and November 16t 2021 with the HOA presidents. The communities agreed that if the left-turn lane was added at Southwest 148th Avenue and Sheridan Street, then the recommendations were as follows:

1. There would be no direct access onto 148th Avenue from the homes and the Automotive Group.
2. There would be restrictions on the use of 148th Avenue for test drives from homes and the Automotive Group.
3. There would be no-thru truck restrictions on Southwest 148th Avenue.
4. To add a dedicated right-turn lane on westbound Sheridan Street onto 148th Avenue northbound with additional stacking distance and add a dedicated acceleration lane from 148th Avenue southbound onto Sheridan Street heading westbound.

The communities agreed that if no left-turn lane option was adopted to the Southwest 148th Avenue intersection, then the recommendations were:

1. No direct access onto 148th from Home and Automotive.
2. Restrict the use of the 148th Avenue for test drives, or any test drives for Home and Automotive.



3. Extend the lane for the vehicle U-turn the stacking eastbound on Sheridan Street at 146th Avenue in Sheridan Street.
4. Add a dedicated right lane on westbound Sheridan Street onto 148th Avenue northbound with additional stacking distance.
5. Add a dedicated acceleration lane which is the same in the other option from 148th Avenue to the south to Sheridan Street heading westbound.

Mr. Vogt recommended that Mayor Paul, on behalf of Town Council, send a letter to Broward County Commissioner Steve Geller and Florida Department of Transportation District Four Secretary Jerry O'Reilly. The Town would ask that the recommendations be incorporated into Broward County Surtax Project design bill for Sheridan Street, which will consider the safety and traffic volume studies.

The Town Council supported moving forward.

**XII. MAYOR AND COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS**

**VICE MAYOR WHITMAN**

**PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE** - Vice Mayor Whitman announced that staff began the repair work on the George Anderson Orange Drive to Griffin Road Pedestrian Bridge.
